As conference planners, it has been our privilege to prepare and host the 28th World Conference.

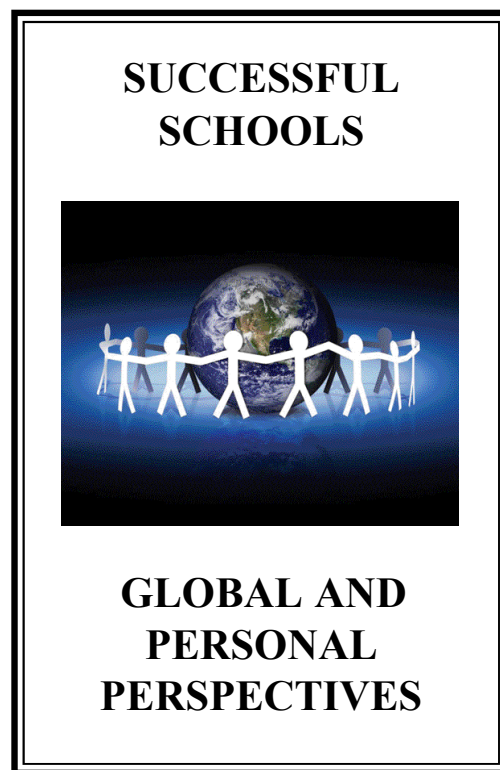

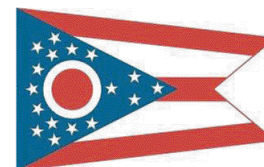

Invitational Education (IE) is a fresh and innovative approach to developing, maintaining, and enhancing optimal learning environments which encourages social and emotional learning, and strengthens culturally responsive education. It is a theory of practice based on optimism, trust, respect, care, and intentionality. It assumes that people are able, valuable, and responsible.

The 2010 International Alliance for Invitational Education World Conference is the 28th gathering of worldwide Alliance members to share their research and practices. It will include dedicated educators, allied professionals, business and community leaders from throughout the United States and many other countries.

The 28th meeting will be held in Columbus, Ohio's capital city, settled in 1812 and named for Christopher Columbus. Ohio was named the Buckeye State because of the abundance of buckeye trees. The buckeye nut is said to resemble the eye of a buck. Ohio's state history began in 1803 when it entered the union as the 17th state. Ohio's flag, the only state flag that is non-rectangular in shape, conveys its history with the 17 stars and the 5 stripes representing the 5 states of the Northwest Territory, of which Ohio was the first.

1 James W. Mahoney – "A New Mosaic"

2 Chelonnda Seroyer – "Creating a Customized and Highly Effective Classroom Management Plan"
